# Weather Log: Student Activity Guide

Weather changes from day to day and sometimes minute to minute. In this activity, you will observe the weather, record weather data, and explore weather patterns.

These directions will get you started. Your teacher will be in contact to guide you and provide information.

### **Materials From The Bag**

• Weather Log (on the back)

#### Part 1: Weather Data Collection

In this part, you will keep a daily record of weather data. It is best to fill out this log one time each day.

- 1. Go to www.weather.com. To get current weather conditions, enter your zip code in the search box.
- 2. Fill in the first day. See the example below.
  - a. For temperature include Fahrenheit and Celsius if possible.
  - b. For current conditions and precipitation look outside and record what you observe.
